

There are many similar examples and we believe KCPL is aware of many of them. The attachment clearly shows two separate interconnection applications – one provided to the customer and one submitted to KCPL.

We would prefer to resolve this issue amicably before taking further action. If satisfactory action is not taken by June 14th, MOSEIA will file a formal complaint at the Public Service Commission in addition to taking other appropriate actions to prohibit this unscrupulous behavior.

MOSEIA values its relationship with KCPL. We want to work together to make the solar industry in Missouri better and stronger. We are happy to serve as a resource to KCPL and make recommendations to prohibit similar issues from happening again. Please respond to this letter at your earliest convenience.
